### **THE LENTEN FILM SERIES CONTINUES THIS WEDNESDAY AT 7 PM**

Each year during Lent, after beginning with our Ash Wednesday service, we continue with a series of films each Wednesday at 7 PM that reflect in thoughtful and often provocative ways on living out and struggling with the Gospel in our day to day lives.

The film this Wednesday, March 20<sup>th</sup>, is ***Silence***. Based upon an acclaimed Japanese novel, Martin Scorsese, one of the world's great filmmakers, had been yearning to make this film for decades. Two years ago, he fulfilled that yearning with a film that is "*a technical and soulful marvel.*" (Peter Travers, Rolling Stone). Rene Rodriguez, the film critic for the Miami Herald describes it well: "*'Silence' feels like a career summation for a filmmaker who has spent his life exploring his faith through his work.* Here is a movie about the importance of religion that will move you, regardless of whichever God you worship - or don't. You will be talking and reflecting on this film long after the closing credits finish rolling.

This inspiring spectacle of a picture takes in the sweep and power of the novel by Victor Hugo, and his impassioned meditation on grace and justice. You will leave moved and inspired, and maybe even singing a bit!

And I am purposely saving the best and most inspiring for last, the remarkable documentary on the life and witness of Rev. Fred Rogers, *Mr. Rogers*, a film that received a stunning 98% rating on Rotten Tomatoes, will move and touch you in ways that might very well bring you to tears. It's that good.
