WE'RE IN THE RUNNING FOR \$17,000.00 plus!

This past Sunday evening, we sent in a grant request to the Coral Gables Fund for over \$17,000.00, a special fund of our regional body, the Presbytery of Tropical Florida. If we receive that money, we're going to use it in exciting ways to live into our new vision of Inviting and Welcoming Everyone into God's Amazing Love!

1. We're going to create a cool new gathering space in the back of the sanctuary that folks can use during worship, but can also be configured for Bible Study and other such activities. And it's going to look awesome because we have our very own in-house designer in Sue Huff, who is also using her contacts in the industry to get fabrics donated and custom chairs built at a fraction of the normal cost.
2. We're going to renovate the lobby area with brand new furnishings and cool new graphic art that will feature pictures of our amazing church family, complete with the three core words of our vision: Invited, Welcomed and Loved.
3. We're going to create a beautiful new nursery space with new carpet, new furnishings and a video feed right into the sanctuary so parents can watch their kids and the service, too!

Once we get this grant, we will change the whole front entrance space of our church into a space more inviting and welcoming than ever before! So please pray that God will give us favor with the fund committee and these funds will come to us! And thanks to Sue Huff, Leslie Young, and Kathy Hinman, who attended a workshop that was one of the pre-requisites for this grant, and to Sue Huff and Judy Gensel, who attended the follow up workshop this past Monday.
